Speakers

Jeffrey A. Bloom is the Country Director for Japan in the International Cooperation Office of the Under Secretary of Defense for Acquisition, Technology, and Logistics OUSD (AT&L). In this position since March 2000, he is responsible for all US-Japan matters relating to defense technology, equipment, equipment sustainment, and armaments cooperation. Mr. Bloom has directed the activities of the US-Japan Systems and Technology Forum (S&TF), chaired by the Under Secretary of Defense, OUSD (AT&L), during one of the most dynamic times in US-Japan relations. During this time, Japan has adopted an aggressive policy towards missile defense cooperation, and has instituted policy and procedural changes to enhance armaments cooperation. He co-chairs the US-Japan (S&TF) Technology Group, a subordinate forum to the S&TF. In his previous assignment, while on active duty with the US Navy, he served as the Japan Country Director in the Navy International Programs Office. In this position, he was responsible for managing FMS sales of US Navy equipment to Japan. Prior to that assignment, he had two Navy tours in Japan, 1994-1996 in Yokosuka, Japan with the Seventh Fleet Staff and from 1992-1994 as Tactics and Operations Officer with an A-6 Squadron forward deployed to Atsugi, Japan. Mr. Bloom holds a Masters of Arts degree in Asian Studies from Cornell University and a Masters of Public Administration from Troy State University. His professional military education includes the US Navy War College in Newport, RI in 1987.

Paul S. Giarra is a Senior Analyst and Deputy Operations Manager and Director of the Global Strategies and Transformation Program in the Strategic Assessment Center, which is part of Hicks and Associates, Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of SAIC. An interagency community expert, he is responsible for long-range planning, wargaming, and strategic assessment for domestic and international government and commercial clients. During

his Naval career (1972-1995), Mr. Giarra was a Naval aviator, naval strategic planner, and a political-military strategic planner for Far East, South Asia and Pacific issues. From 1991 to 1995, Mr. Giarra was the Senior Country Director for Japan in the Office of the Assistant Secretary of Defense for International Security Affairs. He led the interagency in the DoD effort to restructure US national security policy toward Japan during a period of profound transition. He established the US-Japan Theater Missile Defense Working Group, and led the US-Japan Initiative for Assistant Secretary of Defense Joseph Nye, culminating in the 1996 Tokyo Security Summit. From 1988 to 1991, Mr. Giarra was assigned to the Strategic Concepts Group (OP-603) on the Staff of the Chief of Naval Operations, responsible for the formation of global naval strategy and policy, strategic wargaming, regional strategy, and Navy strategic planning in Asia. Mr. Giarra has a Bachelor of Arts degree in History from Harvard College and a Master of Arts degree in International Relations from Salve Regina College 1984 (In conjunction with the US Naval War College).

Mr. Giarra is co-author with Ezra F. Vogel and Michael Blaker of the 2002 US Peace Institute book, *Case Studies in Japanese Negotiating Behavior*
