Matthew Ciolek (<http://www.ciolek.com>) has used ftp-, wais-, gopher-, web- and email-based technologies to make Australia National University's research materials and expertise freely available to the Internet community. He is one of the world's pioneers in electronic communication regarding the Asia-Pacific region. He is, perhaps, most widely known as the founder and editor of the electronic journal "Asian Studies WWW Monitor" [est. Jun

1994] (<http://coombs.anu.edu.au/asia-www-monitor.html>) and of a number of online guides to the scholarly Internet, including the influential Asian Studies WWW Virtual Library [est. Mar 1994] (<http://coombs.anu.edu.au/WWWVL-AsianStudies.html>). Dr. Ciolek heads the Internet Publications Bureau, Research School of Pacific and Asian Studies at ANU in Canberra, Australia. Since 1997 Dr Ciolek has been a member of the Work Group for Electronic Resource Development of The Association for Asian Studies Inc. (AAS) (www.aasianst.org), and since 1998, a member of the Steering Committee of the Electronic Cultural Atlas Initiative (ECAI)
