Senior Fellow for Asian and Economic Studies at the Council on Foreign Relations. He is an expert on the Japanese economy and U.S. economic relations with Japan and Asia, author of *East Asian Economic Regionalism* (Brookings, 2004), *Arthritic Japan: the Slow Pace of Economic Reform* and several other books. Before joining the Council, Lincoln spent 16 years at the Brookings Institution, a career interrupted by a stint of three years at the American Embassy in Tokyo as Special Economic Advisor to Ambassador Walter Mondale in the mid-1990s. Lincoln, a frequent public speaker and television commentator, writes a regular column for *Newsweek Japan*, and his articles have appeared in *Foreign Affairs*, *Nihon Keizai Shimbun*, *The Brookings Review*, and elsewhere.
